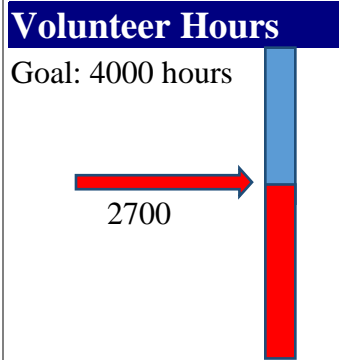




Denton Citizen Police Academy Alumni Association 2nd Quarter Newsletter 2018

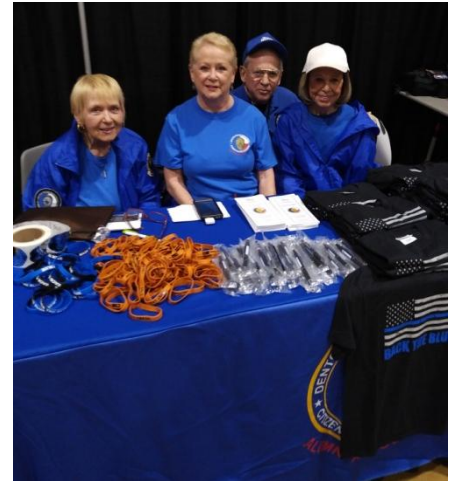
