

CPV Program Admission Requirements

- Must be a United States citizen
- Must be at least 18 years of age
- Must have a valid Texas Driver's License or Texas ID
- Must have current automobile insurance (if driving volunteer patrol vehicle or other city vehicle)
- Must not have been convicted of a felony
- Must not have received excessive traffic citations in the last three years
- Must live, work or be a student in the City of Denton (those outside the City of Denton will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis)

Must successfully complete:

- An interview with the Denton Assistant Chief of Police
- DPS CCH Background Check
- Fingerprint submission
- CJIS Level 2 online course
- TLETS TCIC CJP online course

Initial and refresher training is provided by the Denton Police Department, including an overview of department policy, goals and procedures. Specific rules, regulations and skills training for each area are provided as needed.



Responsibilities

Include, but are not limited to:

- Proper execution of assigned duties
- Proper care, control, and use of any departmental resources, equipment, materials or supplies
- Being familiar with and adhering to all rules, regulations and policies of the CPV Program and the Denton Police Department (as they apply to volunteers)
- Reporting through the chain of command any issues that may affect the Department and its operations, or the general public
- Regarding all information learned as part of CPV Program activities as confidential
- Exercising common sense and good judgment while participating in the program
- Being responsible for their own acts and not shifting this burden to others
